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Energy Tax Credit for Existing Homes

The Department of Energy reports that 80% of homes built before 1980 are under insulated. With the recent passage of The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, you may qualify for a 30% tax credit up to \$1,500 by adding insulation to your home.

How to qualify for the tax credit:

1. Install Fiberlite's Cellulose Insulation in your attic or walls between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2009.
2. Save your receipts and complete Fiberlite Technologies, Inc. Manufacturer's Statement.
3. Claim a 30% tax credit on your 2009 tax return.

Frequently Asked Questions

How Much Is The Tax Credit?

The tax credit is 30% of material cost up to \$1,500 (lifetime cap). For example, if you spend \$500 (material cost) to upgrade your existing insulation you will receive a \$150 tax credit.

What is the difference between a tax credit and a tax deduction?

A deduction reduces your taxable income and a tax credit directly reduces your taxes dollar for dollar. For example, if you incur \$150 in taxes, a \$150 insulation tax credit would mean you owe the IRS zero.

Does the \$1,500 tax credit double for married people filing a joint return?

No, the \$1,500 tax credit does not double for married people filing jointly unless both you and your spouse owned and lived apart in separate main homes.
